# Welcome from the Edinburgh Festival Fringe Society

The Edinburgh Festival Fringe Society warmly welcomes you to join us at Fringe Central.

At Fringe Central we offer support on all aspects of participating in the Fringe and practical services for those visiting it, such as access to printing and free Wi-Fi.

Services for artists, arts industry and media are located within one central and accessible space. **Fringe Central is an artists' home away from home during August,** a place where artists participating in the Fringe can meet, prepare, chat and relax.

# Fringe Central services are open from Wednesday 31 July 2024 to Monday 26 August 2024 from 10:00 to 17:00, seven days per week

Fringe Central participants have access to the majority of the building, with the exception of Grassmarket Community Projects offices and wood workshop. All areas open to artists will be signposted appropriately.

**Our staff are located on the ground and first floor of the building**, based in the spaces outlined below.

Our Fringe Central reception team can answer any enquiries and are situated at the building's entrance.



The main hall where events take place is located directly behind the reception desk. When an event is not happening, artists are welcome to use this space to relax and work.



**The Artist Services Team** can be found on the ground floor along the corridor to the left of the entrance.





The Arts Industry and Media Offices can be found up the stairs on the first floor. A lift is available for those with additional access requirements, more details on access to the lift can be found on page 10.

Fringe Central can get very busy, so if you find the noise and buzz of the space too much at any point, feel free to take some time in our quiet space which is located in the counselling room – this can be accessed via the Artist Services office on the ground floor.

# The entrance to this doorway is 82cm x 197.5cm

The **quiet space** has sunglasses and ear defenders available to borrow and a variety of fidget and sensory aids available to take away.



Fringe Central is also working in partnership with **Health in Mind** to provide mental health support throughout the festival to Fringe participants and can be found in the Artist Services office.





Grassmarket Community Project has its own on-site cafe restaurant, **Coffee Saints** situated in the pavilion on the right side upon entering.

Please note, cafe seating in the pavilion can be used by Fringe participants, but the cafe's customers will be given priority. Allergens will be clearly listed.

Grassmarket Community Project offers a 20% discount for any Fringe passholders from the full Coffee Saints menu (Grassmarket Centre location only). To redeem this offer, show your pass to a member of staff at the till and the discount will be applied.

In addition, Grassmarket Community Project offers basic tea and filter coffee at £1 each while Fringe Central is open (including any cold milk options) for Fringe passholders. This is possible due to the sponsorship provided to Edinburgh Festival Fringe Society by Brodies.





# **The Grassmarket Community Project**

The Grassmarket Community Project, a partnership between the Grassmarket Mission and Greyfriars Kirk, is about supporting people through transitions in their lives and re-connecting disengaged people.

The Grassmarket Community Project is an events and performance space with a community cafe. All proceeds from the cafe and event hire go to supporting vulnerable and isolated adults.

They also run a programme of educational, health, cultural and practical courses, and show free films every week as well as host public events, art displays and activities.

Regular buses are available from various locations to Edinburgh city centre.

The nearest bus stops are located:

- outside the Petit Paris restaurant (a three-minute walk along Grassmarket) for the number 2
- on Forrest Road (a four-minute walk past Greyfriars Kirkyard) for numbers 2, 9, 23, 27, 35 and 45.

# Arriving by car / car parking



There is some metered parking available in the Grassmarket, which charges £7.20 an hour and has a maximum stay of four hours. Paid parking is operational Monday to Saturday 08:30 – 18:30 and Sunday 12:30 – 18:30.

The nearest car park is <u>Castle Terrace NCP</u>. Castle Terrace has 750 spaces and charges **£11.90 for two hours**. They are open 24 hours and have no maximum stay.

**Arriving on foot** 



# The quickest route walking from Waverley Station is as follows:

Take the main exit out of Waverley Station up the ramp. Turn left at the top of the ramp, and at the mini roundabout turn right up the hill. At the top of the road turn left onto the Mound and continue on that road until the crossroads with the Royal Mile. Cross straight over the crossroads and continue along George IV Bridge, passing the libraries on both sides.

Look out for the Greyfriars Bobby statue on the right-hand side and head down Candlemaker Row behind it. **Grassmarket Community Project is on the left-hand side, by the mini roundabout, in a glass-fronted building set back from the main road.** 

# Entrance

A ramp is provided at the main entrance on a slight slope.

# The building's entrance is through a double set of doors at least 136cm wide and 230cm

**tall.** There is no electronic access to the building through this door. One door is propped open throughout the summer months, however if you require a wider access route and the second door opened, the cafe team will come and assist you (the entrance is within the eye line of the cafe counter).



# **Reception**

**The reception desk is located on the ground floor in the wide foyer area.** A member of our team will greet you on arrival. You'll be able to recognize our staff by their yellow lanyards and navy-blue branded T shirts and hoodies.

# The reception area is situated in an open space where there is ample room to manoeuvre.



# **Corridors and doors**

# Corridors are a minimum of 136cm wide.

Doors vary in width, the minimum measurements of doors through the building are 81cm wide by 204cm tall.



# Lift, stairs and steps

An access **lift** is available for those with additional access requirements. **The lift is accessible by acquiring the key** from the reception desk on the ground floor.

# The lift has a weight limit of 500kg and is 143cm x 110cm. The entry door is 90cm wide.

The lift is equipped with tactile buttons and audio assistance. When in the lift, you are required to hold the button for the full time you are in motion. Please note there is a sudden thud when the lift first moves.

The **stairwell** provides access to the second floor and can be reached from the reception foyer. There are handrails on both sides.

The maximum number of steps to the second floor is 20. There is a small landing after the first three steps and after the next nine. The

stairwells are well lit.

# **Toilets**

On the ground floor there are two toilet blocks, one which contains two urinals and one cubicle, the other containing four cubicles.

The entrance door is at least 69cm wide x 202cm tall.



**Three gender-neutral toilets** are located on the first floor which are all single cubicle toilets. The entry to these bathrooms is at least 69cm wide by 202cm tall. The single cubicle bathrooms are 160cm x 108cm.

Accessible toilets are located both on the ground floor and the first floor, and the accessible toilet on the ground floor also has baby changing facilities.



- The upstairs accessible toilet entrance door is 79cm wide x 203cm tall. The room measures 225cm x 183cm.
- The downstairs accessible toilet has an entrance door which is 79.3cm wide and 203cm tall.

### The room measures 207cm x 262cm.

Hand dryers can be found in all the toilets. Paper towels are available upon request from the Fringe Central reception desk.

# **Communication support**

The large hall on the ground floor is our event space and a space for artists when events are not happening.

The event space is equipped with audio-visual equipment and has hearing loop assistance.

# **Assistance dogs**

### Assistance dogs are always welcome.

Grassmarket Community Project has a water bowl in their courtyard which is refilled regularly.

# We can also provide bowls for dogs on request from the reception.

The closest dog exercise facilities are in Greyfriars Kirkyard immediately behind the building.



# **Emergency exits**

Emergency exits are located as follows:



- **Back door in the woodwork workshop** onto Greyfriars Kirkyard then down steps to Candlemaker Row.
- **Back door on ground floor corridor** out to access walkway to front of the building then onto Candlemaker Row.
- Fire exit door on first floor corridor out to access walkway to front of the building then onto Candlemaker Row.
- Front fire exit doors to courtyard then onto Candlemaker Row.
- Main entrance and exit doors to courtyard then onto Candlemaker Row.
- Old Kirkhouse door to Candlemaker Row (will need to be unlocked using internal knob, no key is required).
- Pavillion doors to courtyard then onto Candlemaker Row.





An evacuation assist chair is available on the first floor area outside the woodwork workshop.

# **Fire assembly point**

The assembly point is Lackdhu art shop on Candlemaker Row.
